<b>House Bill 4</b> Kentucky Youth Advocates supported this bill	Anti-grooming legislation	Passed the house, modified in the senate, and needs concurrence vote in house
<b>House Bill 227</b> Family Foundation of KY supported this bill	A.I. surveillance to estimate age to restrict addictive features of social media	Passed the state house
<b>House Bill 778</b> KY Family Association supported this bill	Expanded drug testing and rule against sex-offenders being able to adopt or be a foster parent	Passed the state house and passed the state senate committee but needs a vote in the state senate
<b>House Bill 422</b> Logan's Law	Judges and juries cannot accept an insanity defense for one charge and reject it for another	Passed the state house
<b>Senate Bill 138</b> Jayden's Law	Death penalty for murder by child abuse or neglect	Passed the state senate committee only
<b>Elections Bills</b>		
<b>House Bill 139</b>	Returns management of election forms to the Secretary of State and keeps secret the votes made for disqualified candidates	Passed the state house and went to a state senate committee
<b>House Bill 534</b>	Omnibus election bill for dealing with illegal immigrant voters, judicial races, etc.	Passed the state house
<b>Senate Bill 154</b> KY Family Association supported this bill	<b>No</b> social security cards and EBT food stamp cards <b>as ID to vote</b>	Passed the state senate
<b>Social Conservative Bills</b>		
<b>House Bill 670</b> KFA and Family Foundation supported this	Getting the Ten Commandments back into the K-12 public schools	Sent to the house education committee
<b>House Bill 862</b> Kentucky Family Association supported this bill	Enables school boards to remove erotic books deemed inappropriate at school board meetings	Sent to the house education committee

## Physician and Pro-life Bills

<b>House Bill 359</b> <b>Senate Bill 320</b> Baby Olivia Act	Show the baby in the womb to middle and high schoolers in sex ed. class	cosponsored by 1/3 of the state house, sent to the house education committee & introduced in KY senate
<b>House Bill 510</b>	Pause in organ donation process if the <i>declared dead</i> donor shows signs of life	Passed the state house and state senate, and awaits the signature by Gov. Beshear
<b>House Bill 646</b>	Penalties for trafficking abortion drugs into KY and penalties for physician-assisted suicide	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>House Bill 714</b> Prenatal Equal Protection Act	Requires the sentencing for illegal abortions to match the sentencing for murder of born people	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>House Bill 784</b>	Prosecution of women who engage in do-it-yourself abortions	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>Senate Bill 72:</b> Healthcare Heroes Recruitment & Retention Act	Physician right of conscience legislation	Passed the state senate

## Legislation We Opposed

<b>House Bill 22</b>	Health insurance coverage mandate for abortion, even for pregnant men	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>House Bill 23</b>	Repeal of our pro-life trigger ban law	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>House Bill 109</b>	Removal of the 60-day waiting period to reconsider getting a divorce if out-of-court custody and financial arrangements are done	Passed state house committee, but house leadership has not decided to have a vote on it
<b>House Bill 198</b>	Legalization of recreational marijuana for those 21 years of age and older	Sent to house judiciary committee
<b>House Bill 199</b>	Recreational marijuana state constitutional amendment	Sent to constitutional amendments committee
<b>House Bill 606</b> (with no real safeguards for this amendment process)	Creation of a citizen-initiated constitutional amendment process	Sent to constitutional amendments committee
<b>House Bill 817</b>	Permission to hide dead newborns from law enforcement	Sent to house judiciary committee
